CREATION OF THE INTERMEDIATE COURSE FOR THE REGIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM IN CONSERVATION OF GRAPHIC WORKS

Caracas, January 1995

1. Project Title:

Creation of the Intermediate Course for the Regional Training Program in Conservation of Graphic Works:

Description

The Regional Training Program in Conservation of Graphic Works was created in 1984 by the National Library of Venezuela's Conservation Center (CCBNV), which is also the Regional Center for IFLA's Preservation and Conservation Program (IFLA-PAC).

During the first stage, from 1984-1988, the Program's basic level course was instrumented by the CCBNV with the support of important national and international institutions: the Gran Mariscal de Ayacucho Foundation of Venezuela, the UN' Perez Guerrero Fund, UNESCO and the Norwegian Government.

The present Project aims at consolidating the Training Program through the creation of the intermediate-level course. Its purpose is to provide better qualified conservation and preservation personnel for our Region's libraries, archives, museums, registries, historical centers and humanistic and scientific research centers, particularly those dealing with XVI to XVIII Century American documents. It must be pointed out that existing educational institutions are not currently training such technical personnel.

This project will constitute an important part of the many activities carried out by the CNCBNV with the support of its experienced specialists, well-equiped laboratories, and facilities for classes and workshops. The cycle of specialized seminars, conducted by foreign experts, will undoubtedly become one of the focal points of the course.

9. Project Justification:

One of the primary functions assigned to the Conservation Center of the National Library of Venezuela (CCBNV), as Regional Center for IFLA's Preservation and Conservation Program (PAC) is to lend technical assistance to the Libraries and Historical Archives of Latin America and the Caribbean. As individual demands for assistance largely exceed the Center's capacity, CCBNV considers that one of the most efficient ways of responding to requests is by offering Regional training programs in conservation for Library and Archives personnel.

The present Training Program addresses Spanish-speaking countries. During its first stage (1984-1988), 34 participants from Colombia, Chile, Peru, Brazil, Panama, Uruguay, Costa Rica, Honduras, El Salvador, Bolivia, Nicaragua, Dominican Republic, Cuba, Ecuador and Venezuela were trained as conservation assistants. On the basis of requests received from the above countries, we consider that it is now necessary to create the intermediate course of the Program.

Theis second course will provide the conservation specialist with the knowledge and techniques to manipulate three different categories of works on paper, namely books

and their structures, photographs, and materials such as maps, posters and works of art.

Admission requirements

- -Evaluation based on characteristics described in Basic Level
- -Letter of nomination by an institution interested in the candidate's services
- -Personal Interview
- -Credits obtained in schools of arts and crafts may be duly accredited after evaluation

Dedication and duration of course

The intermediate level is a two-year course (4 semesters), consisting of approximately 2400 class hours (lectures and workshops). A minimum of 15 hours a week of classwork is required.

Instructors

Venezuelan specialists who work at the CCBNV, and accredited professors and experts who work in other institutions or on their own

Evaluation

Evaluation is continuous, cummulative and systematic. Grade scale is from 1 to 5, and minimum passing grade is 4.

Certificate

Upon successful completion of the course, the student receives a Certificate issued by the Universidad Nacional Experimental "Simon Rodriguez" and the National Library of Venezuela

- Select equipment, instruments, conservation materials and bibliographic materials to be used in the course
- Select participants: candidates who graduated from the basic level and/or other qualified persons
